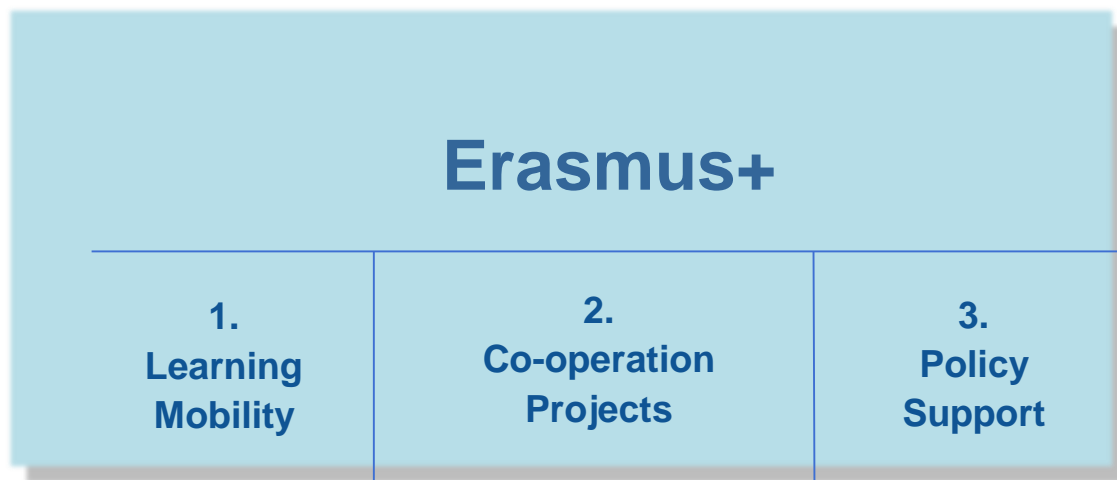

Jean Monnet – How does it work?

Action grants to promote excellence through:

- Teaching and research (Modules, Chairs, Centres of Excellence)
- Policy debate with academic world (Networks, Projects)
- Support to activities of Associations

Teaching and research in the field of EU-studies

- **MODULES**

Min 40 teaching hours/year, 3-year grants (max grant: € 30.000)

- **CHAIRS**

Chair Holder: Min 90 teaching/year + at least 1 additional activity/year, 3-year grants (max grant: € 50.000)

- **CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE**

Focal points of competence and knowledge, 3-year grants, (max grant: € 100.000)

Duration: 2014–2017

Participants: students, academics, policy makers from Europe, Japan, South Korea

Debating the European Union in Cologne and Paris (EUCOPAS')

Duration: 2015-2018

Participants: students from different disciplines, researchers, civil servants, organised civil society and general public at large

Policy debate and exchanges

NETWORKS:

foster creation, development of consortia of international players (HEIs, Centres of Excellence, departments, etc.) in area of EU studies.

Involvement minimum 3 partner institutions from 3 different countries, 3-year grants; (max grant: € 300.000)

PROJECTS:

support innovation, cross-fertilisation, spread of EU content. Involvement of other partners possible, duration 12 - 18 - 24 months; (max grant: € 60.000)

Example 4: Jean Monnet Project

Enhanced EU content in primary school curricula Slovenian primary schools integrate EU topics in school curricula

Duration: 2014-2015

Participants: university students of primary school education, school teachers, pupils, local communities

Example 5: Jean Monnet Network

Participants: young academics, researchers, stakeholders active in field from 18 countries (BE, PT, CY, HU, CH, IS, LT, AT, UK, NL, FI, ES, IT, DE, FR, NO, SI, CZ,)

Support to Associations

Support to Associations:

contribute to the study of the EU integration process, interdisciplinary approach, officially registered and independent; open to all interested professors, teachers and researchers specialising in EU issues, at regional, national or supranational level; 3-year grants; (max grant: € 50.000)

Example 6: Support to Associations

Communicating the EU in Ireland

Duration: 2015 – 2018

Participants: multi-disciplinary association of scholars and practitioners, representatives of Irish universities and civil society, north and south in Ireland.

Jean Monnet Selection Results 2019

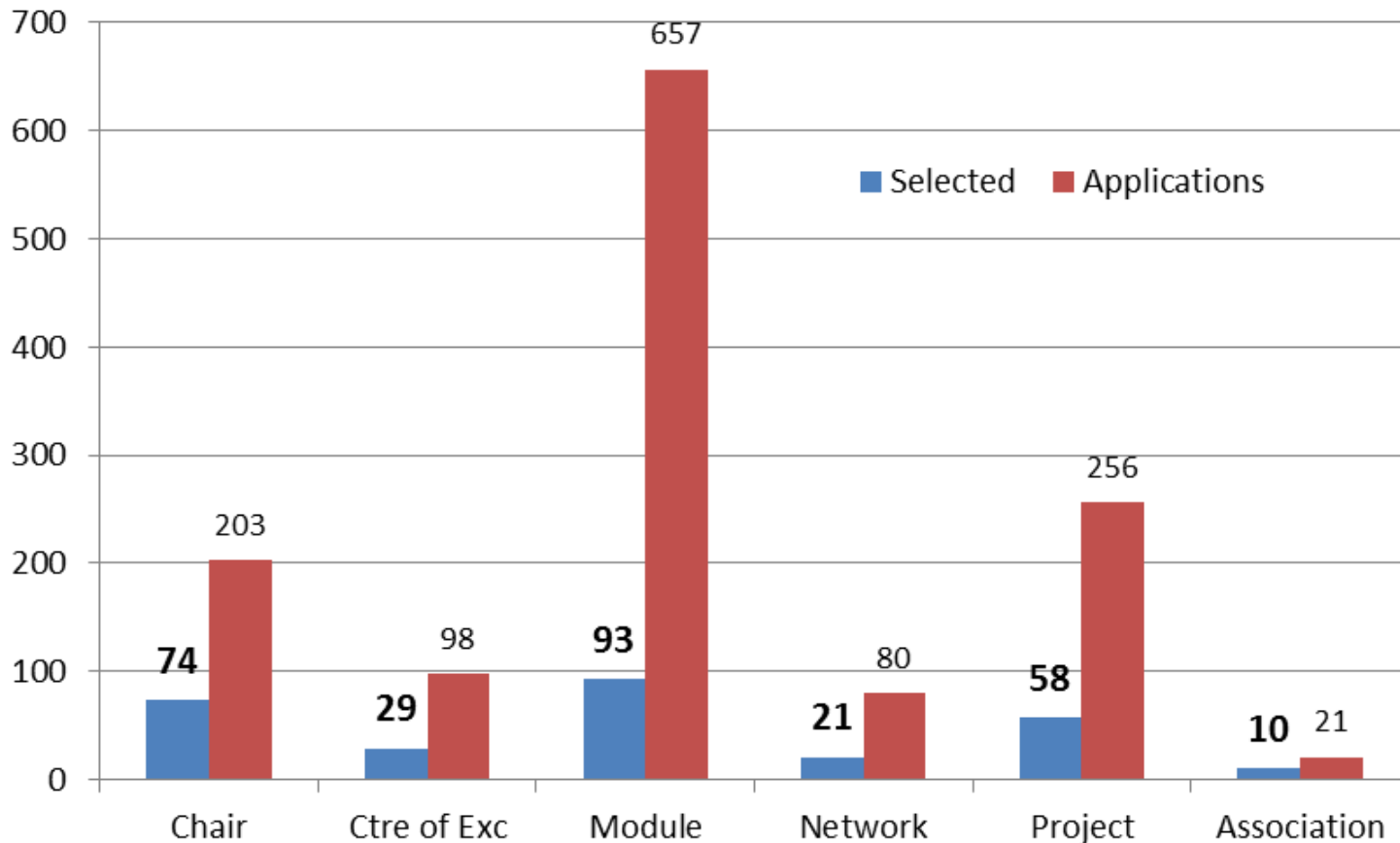
- **Budget available: EUR 17.7 million**
- €13.7 million Jean Monnet funds,
- €3.5 million for certain Partner Countries (Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Hong Kong SAR, Iran, Japan, Korea, Macao, Mexico, Russian Federation, Singapore, United States of America.)
- €0.25 million for Ukraine and €0.25 million for Georgia.

Applications received: 1315

Projects selected: 285 (181 Programme countries, 104 Partner Countries)

Success rate: 22%

Next Call for Proposals 2020

Budget available:

€14.6 million Jean Monnet funds

+ €3.5 million for certain Partner Countries. Indicatively:

Australia, Canada, China, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, New Zealand, South Africa.

Deadline for applications: **20 February 2020 at 17:00 CET**

➤ Starting date of projects: **01/09/2020**

How to apply?

- Apply directly to Executive Agency (EACEA)
- Applicants from all countries
- Applicants: HEIs or organisations active in EU subject area, depending on the action type
- HEIs in E+ Programme countries >>> ECHE
- Only one applicant institution is required / except Networks

E-tutorial: 'How to prepare a competitive proposal'

How to apply?

Applications must be submitted using the eForm with attachments

1. Applicant organisation (for Networks also partner institutions) be registered in Participant Portal and receive Participant Identification Code (PIC)
2. Create official electronic application form (eForm)
3. Fill in eForm
4. Attach completed versions of different attachments to the application/e-form

Verification of eligibility, assessments of projects	March – May 2020
Evaluation Committee for selection of projects	June 2020
Award decision	July 2020
Notification of applicants and publication of results on EACEA website	July 2020
Preparation of Grant Agreements/Decisions	From July 2020 on
Start of projects	1 September 2020
