Why joint study programmes?

The European Commission:

- Bologna Process objectives
- Increasing the attractiveness of the EHEA
- European values
- Encouraging students to become "European citizens"
- Networks of excellence
- International credibility and visibility for partner institutions



Why joint study programmes?

Institutional level:

- Raise visibility and reputation of the institution
- Strengthen (strategic) international education and research collaboration
- Increase foreign student enrolment to internationalise or raise institutional revenue
- Tool for institutionalising co-operation with consortium partners, leading to a more sustainable strategic relationship

Why joint study programmes? Programme level (1)

- 1. Broaden or deepen education offering
- 2. Develop a more internationalised curriculum
- 3. Offer a specialist, innovative curriculum by combining the education & research strengths of individual institutions (sum is more than the part).
- 4. A coherent course with an automatically integrated international component
- 5. Increase intercultural competences of students and staff, not only through mobility, but also by internationalisation at home.
- 6. Improve graduate employability through curricula that respond to the demands of a global labour market.



Why joint study programmes? Programme level (2)

- 7. Raise the international visibility and prestige of the programme
- 8. Attracting new student nationalities
- 9. Gaining access to research expertise and networks of the partner institution
- 10. Joint curriculum development offers a unique possibility of benchmarking quality with academic peers

Why joint study programmes?

Benefits for academics:

- Opportunities to learn about other contexts & teaching and learning methods
- Student diversity in the classroom
- Networks for future teaching collaboration
- Research contacts
- Intercultural competences





Benefit of a JP for students:

Follow an international jointly developed curriculum, combining academic expertise available in different countries, with automatic recognition of credits gained abroad
